"Tri Delta was founded as a society that is "kind alike to all", and through our philanthropy, we keep the vision of our founders alive. As Tri Deltas, we are passionate about serving others, and our passion is evident through our commitment to philanthropy. Our philanthropic mission is to change the way the world treats and defeats childhood cancer through our work with the local Toronto hospital, Sick Kids, and through our national partnership with St. Jude Children's Hospital, located in Memphis, Tennessee. Tri Delta has been in partnership with St. Jude for 25 years, where we pledged to donate \$100 million dollars, and as of now we are only \$7 million away! In honour of our dedication to St. Jude, the hospital named its oncampus, short term housing facility after our sorority, known as Tri Delta place. Last month, 2 of our members were given the opportunity to go to Memphis to visit the hospital!"

"At Canada Alpha, our main fundraising events have been renowned as Tri Delta traditions. In the fall, we host DHOP, otherwise known as Delta House of Pancakes. At this event, we run our own pancake business for the night by making pancakes for the community! In the winter, we participate in Sincerely, Yours, a letter writing campaign sent to family and friends to individually raise money for our philanthropy.

Tri Deltas are dedicated to helping children live, scientists learn, and aid St. Jude in furthering their mission of finding cures for childhood cancer and other life threatening diseases. When we participate in our philanthropic events, a bond is created between Tri Delta's, connecting us and each other with our values of truth, self-sacrifice, and friendship."

"Heart Week is Alpha Phi's signature philanthropy event and it takes place every year during the week of Valentine's Day! It's a super fun week of events, some of which change from year to year. Recently we've done Candy Grams, King of Hearts, Therapy Dogs, Dessert Night, Merch Sales, Yoga Classes, and a Nike 5K run! All of the money raised during this week goes to the Alpha Phi Foundation and/or the Heart & Stroke Foundation, and all donations to Heart & Stroke during this month are matched and so our contributions are doubled. In addition to Heart Week, we host other one-off events during the Fall and Winter Semesters, such as Mac and Phis, our collaboration with Phi Gamma Delta to raise money for the March For Our Lives organization. Our philanthropy events in Winter 2023 raised over 3000 dollars before any matching!"

Last year, we hosted Spooking Hunger in the Fall where we turned our chapter house into a haunted house for Halloween. very spring, we host our signature philanthropy event, Foods of the World, an all-you-can-eat event showcasing cuisine representing the cultural diversity of our members. We are proud to have raised \$1,255 for the Alpha Gamma Delta Foundation's Fighting Hunger grant program in 2022-2023."

Monthly, we volunteer at Friday Food Ministry at St. Thomas Church, preparing and serving hot meals to people experiencing homelessness in our community. GAMMA PHI BETA


